The Youth Club was started in the late 1950's by my dad Ernie Lake. It ran on a Thursday and Saturday night with a table tennis table, dart board and a large snooker table in the vestry.

During the 90's we stopped running the club on a Thursday evening and concentrated on a Saturday night.

The format has, of course, changed drastically over the years. During the 60's and early 70's it just had a record player with 45's in the corner, after the "box" was built by the Mottingham Players (the drama group made up of church and club members) club took on a more disco theme and currently we run with team games and music. We feel exceptionally honoured connected with club and with God's help and guidance we hope to be able to keep offering a safe and enjoyable environment for young people.

SATURDAY NIGHT YOUTH CLUB KIERIN LOGHLIN'S REFLECTION

I have been going to the Saturday Night Youth Club since 2013. A regular night of the youth club starts at seven o clock. Two members become captains and take turns choosing their team. The teams compete in various games and accumulate points. People are able to talk to friends and new people they

haven't necessarily spoken to before in and out of the games. Once the games have finished the team with the most points wins and each member of the winning team then has an opportunity to take part in a raffle, with prizes from the tuck shop to win.

The DNA of the club that makes

it so successful is Tony and Elaine who voluntarily run the club every week. Every week they never fail to bring so much energy and passion to our club through their organisation and supervising. Their warmth and humour never fails to shine and they are very approachable and easy to talk to, creating an inviting and relaxing environment.

The Saturday Night Club is a place where people can talk and have a laugh in a relaxed, friendly atmosphere. The club has given

me an opportunity to talk to my friends every week and has also allowed me to make new friends. Every week the club has been a constant in my life I can always rely on to feel happy and have a laugh.

In these ways I believe Saturday Night Club has boosted my confidence and ability to socialise so is undoubtedly the highlight of my week. The fond memories and experiences I have had there makes club priceless to me, so is great value for the pound I pay every week.



THE FORGOTTEN FATHER: JOSEPH THE CARPENTER

Good old Joseph - the vital but often overlooked character in all those Nativity plays, who still has so much to say to dads today. There he was, described in the Bible as an honourable guy, engaged to an honourable and celibate young woman when he found she was pregnant! Should

they call the marriage off? His big test of faith - and love for Mary - came when an angel said the Holy Spirit was creating a special Son. Joseph honoured God and honoured Mary, curbing his 'conjugal rights' and caring for her through their journeys and the birth of Jesus.

But, deep down, we realise it is such a good change, such a positive enrichment of our lives, our loves and our purpose. Like Joseph, we can rejoice in the arrival of the Christ child and relish a life spent loving him.


